## **Interaction and Discussion**

These activities focus on fostering interactive communication in the classroom, allowing students to engage with the language in meaningful and personalized ways.

#### **Picture Talk**

- Description: Display a picture and lead a discussion in the target language, asking questions and narrating the scene.
- Time: 10-15 minutes
- Tips for Success: Use pictures that are culturally relevant or connected to students' interests to boost engagement. Keep questions simple and gradually increase complexity.

#### **PQA (Personalized Questions and Answers)**

- Description: Ask students personalized questions related to a theme or topic, encouraging them to respond in the target language.
- Time: 10-12 minutes
- Tips for Success: Tailor questions to students' lives to make the conversation relevant. Use visual aids or gestures to support understanding

#### **Special Person Interviews**

- **Description**: Conduct interviews with one student at a time, focusing on their likes, dislikes, and personal experiences.
- Time: 10-15 minutes
- **Tips for Success**: Prepare a set of questions in advance and encourage students to answer in detail. Use this activity regularly to build classroom community.

#### **Card Talk**

- **Description**: Students draw or bring in images related to a theme (e.g., hobbies, favorite foods) and discuss them in the target language.
- **Time**: 15-20 minutes
- **Tips for Success**: Allow students to prepare their images ahead of time. Use this activity to introduce or reinforce vocabulary.

#### **1Weekend Chats**

- **Description**: Discuss what students did over the weekend, using past tense and encouraging detailed responses.
- Time: 10-15 minutes
- **Tips for Success**: Model responses before asking students to share. Use visual supports like pictures or timelines to help with comprehension.

#### **Calendar Talk**

- **Description**: Discuss the day, date, weather, and any special events, using the target language to build routine and familiarity.
- Time: 5-7 minutes
- **Tips for Success**: Incorporate questions and student participation. Use visuals like calendars and weather icons to support understanding.

# **Storytelling and Narrative**

These activities involve students in storytelling and narratives, offering a rich context for language acquisition through listening and speaking.

### **Story Listening**

- **Description**: Tell a story in the target language, using gestures, drawings, and props to enhance comprehension.
- **Time**: 15-20 minutes
- **Tips for Success**: Choose stories that are simple and engaging. Use repetition and variation to reinforce key vocabulary and structures.

#### **Write and Discuss**

- **Description**: After a class discussion or storytelling activity, write a summary together as a class, reinforcing the language used.
- Time: 10-15 minutes
- Tips for Success: Encourage student input during the writing process. Use the written summary as a reading activity in a subsequent lesson.

#### **Movie Talk**

- **Description**: Play a short video clip and pause to describe scenes, ask questions, and discuss what happens in the target language.
- **Time**: 15-20 minutes
- **Tips for Success**: Choose clips with clear visuals and minimal dialogue. Pre-watch the clip to plan pauses and key discussion points.

# **Reading and Writing**

These activities are designed to reinforce comprehension and writing skills through structured and interactive tasks.

#### One Word at a Time

- Description: Create a story with the class, adding one word at a time, encouraging creativity and language use.
- Time: 10-12 minutes
- **Tips for Success:** Start with a prompt or a theme to guide the story. Allow students to suggest words and phrases, providing support as needed.

#### **Embedded Reading**

- **Description**: Present a text in the target language at various levels of complexity, gradually revealing more details as students' comprehension grows.
- Time: 15-25 minutes
- **Tips for Success**: Begin with a simplified version and ask comprehension questions before moving to the next level. Encourage predictions and connections to previous readings.

### **Volleyball Reading**

- **Description**: Use a CI novel or short story. Working in pairs, one student reads a sentence or paragraph in the target language and the other student translates. Then switch roles and continue
- **Time**: 15-20 minutes
- **Tips for Success**: Choose texts at students' proficiency level and that they know so they can focus on the language structures and vocabulary.

#### **Draw the Sentence**

- Description: Working in pairs, each students selects a sentence from a CI novel, informational text or short story and draws a quick and simple picture to represent it. They then exchange the picture and try to locate the sentence it in the text that it represents.
- **Time**: 15-20 minutes
- **Tips for Success**: Choose texts at students' proficiency level and that they know so they can quickly locate the sentence once they have an idea of what it is.

#### **Running Dictation**


- Description: Place sentences around the classroom. Students work in pairs, with one running to read the sentence and the other writing it down.
- **Time**: 15-20 minutes
- Tips for Success: Ensure the sentences are short and related to current classroom themes. Emphasize accuracy in both reading and writing.

#### **Dictation with a Twist**

- Description: Read a sentence aloud, and students write it down, then modify it based on a prompt (e.g., change the tense, add a detail).
- **Time**: 10-15 minutes
- Tips for Success: Start with simple sentences and gradually increase complexity.
  Provide prompts that encourage creativity and language manipulation.
